Dealing with Difference: Opening Dialogue about Lesbian, Gay & Straight Issues, produced by Human Relations Media and GLSEN (82 pages; \$139.95)

This video and print curriculum package is designed to foster healthy classroom dialogue around lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) issues while informing every one of the serious effects anti-LGBT harassment and bullying can have on all students. A mixture of dramatic vignettes and real teen discussion will encourage students to look at their own behavior as well as that of their peers.

Ending Anti-Gay Bias in Schools: A Training of Trainers Manual (111 pages; \$69.95)

GLSEN's Training of Trainers (TOT) manual provides educators and activists with a resource for preparing new facilitators to conduct anti-bias workshops in their local communities. The manual includes an agenda for conducting your own two-day TOT and comes complete with detailed instructions, handouts and surveys.

The GLSEN Workbook (48 pages; \$19.95)

The GLSEN Workbook is a tool for measuring, describing and improving an individual school's climate with regard to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) people and issues. Through a 26-item survey, the GLSEN Workbook helps community members to assess their schools in the areas of policy, programming and practice. The Workbook also includes direct action organizing tools that guide members through the process of creating concrete changes in the lives of students.

I Just Want to Say (Running time: 13 minutes; \$49.95)

Tennis champion Martina Navratilova hosts a candid and moving panel discussion about the climate faced by lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) youth in our schools today, and offers suggestions for how educators can work to teach respect for all. The video also contains trailers of GLSEN's two Public Service Announcements with Judy Shepard.

Out of the Past Curriculum Kit (Running time: 65 minutes. \$49.95)

Told through the eyes of Kelli Peterson, a 17-year-old high school student in Salt Lake City, Utah, Out of the Past explores Kelli's history-making experience of forming a gay-straight alliance (GSA) in her public school. The protests and legislative battles serve as a modern counterpoint to the history of human rights movements. The struggles and triumphs of Bayard Rustin, Barbara Gittings and other civil rights activists are also profiled in this powerful film. Comes with an accompanying Teachers' Guide (see below).

Out of the Past Teachers' Guide (31 pages; \$9.95)

This accompaniment to the Out of the Past video contains historical context, ideas for discussion, and suggested assignments for each of the video's six segments. A glossary, bibliography and resource section are also included.

Outside the Lines: The World of the Gay Athlete (Running time: 17 minutes; \$49.95)

Outside the Lines documents the journeys of two students struggling to compete as openly lesbian and gay athletes in climates that are alternately hostile and welcoming. As they tell their moving stories, both students bring viewers into the world of the lesbian and gay athlete — a world set apart by courage and resilience. An essential resource for coaches and physical educators, the video is accompanied by a viewing guide that provides lesson plan ideas, discussion questions and other resources for building equity in athletics.

Teaching Respect For All (Running time: 52 minutes; \$49.95)

In this educational training video, GLSEN Executive Director and former high school teacher Kevin Jennings helps a live audience of parents, teachers, administrators and other concerned citizens to understand why schools must address anti-gay prejudice if all of our students are to achieve their educational potential.
