















Claim Your Rights

Have you or someone you know experienced lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer (LGBTQI+)-based bullying, harassment, or discrimination in school that school officials are responsible for or have failed to address? The U.S. Department of Education is actively investigating and responding to complaints of anti-LGBTQI+ discrimination, bullying, and harassment.

Take Action

If you have experienced school-based bullying, harassment, or discrimination because you're LGBTQI+, file a complaint with the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) at the U.S. Education Department today.

Things to know about filing a complaint:

You are Entitled to File a Claim

Nearly every K-12 school receives some level of federal funding and is therefore protected under Title IX, which entitles you to file a bullying, harassment, or discrimination claim with OCR.

Time is of the Essence

A complaint must be filed within 180 days of when the bullying, harassment, or discrimination occurred.

Your Confidentiality is Assured

Every claim remains confidential and will not be shared without permission.

A Third Party May File a Claim on Behalf of Another Person

In other words, the person making the complaint doesn't have to be the one who experienced the harassment. A friend, family member or school faculty member can file the complaint.

It's Safe

The school cannot retaliate against anyone who has made a complaint, or testified, assisted, or participated in any manner in an investigation or proceeding under Title IX.

You Must Complete the Entire Form in Order for the Report to be Counted

Make sure to fill out the entire form. Incomplete information will result in a dismissal of your complaint.
